Injured workers in California are under assault. As a result of deregulation of workers compensation, their permanent disability has been slashed more than 50%. They face one obstacle after another with company doctors in medical review boards stalling their healthcare and some injured workers have been retaliated against for filing workers compensation claims by district attorneys who at the same time refuse to prosecute insurance companies for fraud.

There are more fish and game inspectors in California than OSHA-Inspectors and the last doctor of Cal-OSHA Larry Rose has not been replaced since he retired. The destruction of Ca-OSHA is a threat to every worker and their family in California.
